

UCSF President's Research Fellowship in the Humanities 2004-05

Eligibility

The 2004-05 UCSF President's Research Fellowship in the Humanities is available to a student in the first year of his/her graduate studies. Contingent upon satisfactory academic progress and funding availability, a second year of support will be awarded when the student advances to candidacy, provided that the student advances in his/her fourth or fifth year of study. The awardee's graduate program will provide support between award years. Nominees must be permanent residents or U.S. citizens.

Purpose

This fellowship proposes to strengthen humanities scholarship and programs within the field of the health sciences. The program seeks to recruit and provide support for the most talented and promising humanities scholars. Social, behavioral and anthropological scholarship that draws explicitly upon humanistic perspectives will be considered within the framework of this fellowship. Nominees must have career goals consistent with teaching and research in higher education.

Support

This fellowship provides a \$10,000 stipend for nine months (September 1, 2004 - May 31, 2005) plus fees. First-year students will receive non-resident tuition if applicable, however dissertation-year awardees are expected to be California residents. Graduate programs are required to support Humanities Fellows for the period between their first-year and dissertation-year awards.

Nomination Procedure

Program Directors may nominate up to three students for the first-year fellowship in 2004-05. Students with other sources of support may not be nominated if their combined stipend and/or salary (including this fellowship) would total more than \$24,500, the 2004-05 maximum for UCSF student support.

To make nominations, please submit the Graduate Division Fellowship Nomination Form to Susan Wong on-line (form available from swong@itsa.ucsf.edu). Separately, please submit four copies of the following materials for each nominee to Dr. Clifford Attkisson, Dean of Graduate Studies, c/o Susan Wong, Millberry Union, Room 200 West:

- One confidential letter of recommendation from UCSF. Nominations may be brief and must include verification of eligibility and merit, highlighting the student's course of study and research within the humanities.
- A statement of academic achievements and significant research work, including abstracts of published papers and all postsecondary honors and activities (i.e. curriculum vitae)

Additional Information

Incomplete and late nominations may not be considered. Pending confirmation of the 2004-05 fellowship allocation from UCOP, one first-year fellowship will be awarded in 2004-05. We plan to announce the award recipient by March 12, 2004.
